The organisation

- Venue: Portugal

- 2 participants from each partner organisation

- All the partners contribute to writing draft and final version, as defined and shared with other partners.

C2 Outputs:

1. Booklet: "What to do in case of ..." providing ideas, suggestions, solutions for a good supported housing (about 3000 characters, spaces included). I draft;
2. Participants expert in Europass CV and European Skills Passport
3. Tips on how to reorganize CV with social and civic skills.

C2 detailed Learning objectives:

- Knowledge: at the end of C2 the participants will know more problems/solutions related to housing pathways for people with mental health issues and/or at risk of social exclusion; they will know Europass Validation methods; they will know social and civil skills, civic engagement methods, useful to develop inclusive local communities.
- Skills: participants will be able to develop social and civil skills in educational sessions; they will be able to improve problem solving within housing project.
- Competence: participants will be stimulated to promote social and civil skills for housing in their working context, with CIVIC target groups. They will be able to integrate social and civil skills in educational pathways and in CV. They will be able to better solve problems in housing pathways. They will be more competent in exchange practices in EU contexts.

Linked Indicators:

- Number of trainers trained in short term training C2 (2 x each country);
- Number of Europass CV and European Skills Passport prepared during C2
- Quality of the training activity C1/C2: Efficiency of management of the training, activation and motivation of the participants, communication and support for their learning opportunities for individual pathways, improved quality of the CV.
- Ability to work in EU team. INDICATOR: n. and quality of interventions, participation with useful questions, product consistency, work accurateness during TPM and Learning/Training
- Activities (C1/C2), orientation towards European contexts

C2 Meeting main characteristics

- The 5- day C2 event allows partners, experts on supported housing, to exchange good practice through: learn from each other and peer learning activities. They will present each other their experience at local level and will explore particular issues, with the other partners, on training communities in order to make them inclusive.
- C2 will support inclusive education and promote civic and social skills for local communities. C2 will discuss good practices as solutions to housing problems. It will be focused on solutions to housing problems
- Each partner will participate with 2 people at C2 thus ensuring the expression of multiple points of view in the events, and, upon their return, detailed information to each local CIVIC staff.

Methodology

The project is based on the exchange of good "housing and inclusion" practices, on comparison of problems faced and solutions implemented, on work methodologies such as: goal- setting, coproduction, storytelling, brainstorming, learning by experience.

The C2 activities is based on the exchange of good practices for the solution of problems encountered during supported housing projects. Problems that mainly concern the 10 key areas for housing, described in the training Curriculum, from which CIVC is inspired. They are: 1. Evaluation process of user skills, 2. Local

context resources, 3. Case manager / network, 4. Evaluation of the representations, perceptions, motivations and satisfaction of users, 5. Flexibility/clinical governance /Communication and coordination, 6. Responsibility and decision making of users, 7. Volunteering system and civil Society, 8. Life-long learning, 9. Resources for housing, 10. Impact evaluation. Each key-area reflects a specific list of indicators.

C2 will use the methodology based on learn from each other, peer to peer learning activities, exchange of good practices. These methods facilitate the comparison of ideas and allow to share EU values of equality, social inclusion and non-discrimination.

Participants will explore particular housing issues with other partners and implement a mutual training on the management of housing problems with people at risk of social exclusion.

Each partner will train the others to deal with specific housing issues starting by their knowhow on supported housing, mental health, community-based approach, human rights, non-formal education, social skills.

The Europass Validation Methods session

During C2 there will be a session dedicated to the presentation of Europass Validation Methods. Then, in order to contribute to clear understanding of skills throughout the EU, the participants, will be invited to create and / or update their CV and the European Skills Passport with particular attention to social and civil skills - as developed by the Hero training Curriculum.

C2 activities added value

CIVIC joint training event – C2 - is centered on the exchange of good practices as a learning resource.

All the partners will compare and share ideas, practices and working methods.

Consistent with the objectives of the project, the attention of the partnership will be directed to the housing experiences of people with serious mental issues, and will be extended to other types of social exclusion; in fact, all the partners believe, starting from their experience, that the training Curriculum could also be used to facilitate the inclusion of other groups at risk of social exclusion. The comparison, the joint analysis of the experiences, the discussion, the feedback that will come from it, will allow to confirm or not this hypothesis.

An Introductory session will open the C2. It will last about one hour, and 3-5 users from the hosting partner will take actively part in it. The activity aims to learn about Housing experiences from people directly involved in it, and to involve them in a direct exchange on housing experiences in different EU countries.

The collaboration will result in the production of the second CIVIC outputs, that is central to the objectives of CIVIC and it will strengthen the ability of the partnership to be active in a EU network.

The second LTT, the C2 meeting - "Competent communities: new skills for a good Housing" focuses on the exchange of good practices on the solution of problems encountered in supporting housing projects.

During the meeting the second CIVIC output will be produced, the booklet, entitled: "What to do in case of ..." providing ideas, suggestions, solutions for a good housing.

Added value of the C2 activities is also given, by: a) the transnational character of the meetings; and, b) CIVIC synergy with national, international and EU policies on education and inclusive societies.

Furthermore, the CIVIC EU partnership will use the two LTT activities, C1 and C2, in harmony with ET2020 and EU Treaty (art.2), to develop tools for Life-long learning educational pathways, reinforcing social and civil skills; and for promoting European values of human dignity and respect for human rights. C1 and C2 are also central to reflecting on how to use Housing good practices, with groups at risk of social exclusion.
